## Virtual Expectations for K-5

Our goal is to stay in-person. We do have two week long virtual breaks scheduled, after Thanksgiving and after winter break. The following will be the expectations for K-5 students. All K-5 students have a device. Most assignments, along with their directions, will be posted on Google Classroom and can be accessed through student iPads and Chromebooks.

While many assignments will be online, some paper and pencil work will continue if we go virtual. A good example of paper pencil work would be math. Teachers would deliver the lesson through a video in their Google Classroom and students would complete the work in their math books.

Students with IEPs will be serviced virtually following the times previously set up in their IEPs. Special Education teachers and therapists will contact each family to set up specific times to meet the minutes outlined in the IEP.

K-5 students will have one daily check in and then will be required to view lessons and complete assignments in Google Classroom. Lessons will be added to the Google Classroom.
